

his presence; "O taste and see that the Lord is good; how blessed is the man who takes refuge in Him!" (Psalm 34:8-9; NASB) This mindset radiates throughout the chapter.

An art gallery once offered a prize for the best painting on "PEACE." Top prize: A giant waterfall, with a tree hanging over the furious waters. The tree leaves partly cover a little bird resting in a nest. Peace is not the absence of storms but tranquility amidst storms. (Encyclopedia of 15,000 Illustrations: Signs of the Times).

I am amazed at how many times Christ went off alone in the scriptures. Here are some examples - Matthew 14:23; Mark 6:47; Luke 9:18. There was a time where God led Christ away to be alone in Luke 4:1-13. It was in this alone time that satan was at his worst. Christ modeled this mindset for us. No matter what satan said, He kept His mind set on the will of God even though He was still hungry and weak and needed angels to minister to Him. Satan had to leave Him because His confident trust in God's Word was His unshakable strength.

Please remember, like Christ did, that the Word triggers the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. When we apply the Word, the Holy Spirit transforms us (Romans 12:2). Our confident trust in God's Word allows the Holy Spirit, who is our peace, to be the peace in our lives, whether our circumstances change or not. "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, and bring to your remembrance all that I said to you. Peace, I leave with you; My peace I give to you..... Let not your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful. (John 14:26-28; NASB)




Center for Christian Living Matters of the Heart Oct. 11th - Nov. 15th



SERMON OUTLINE

Empowered 2 Corinthians 10:5-6

A. Tear Down (v. 5):

- 1. Speculations and our imaginations, when practiced, can become driven by satan and his demons (1 Timothy 1:1-3; 2 Timothy 2:23, 26; James 3:13-16).
- 2. Every thought by itself, is full of pride (maybe because well educated or in powerful positions); is raised against God's knowledge (Romans 12:16).
- 3. A lofty thought is incredibly prideful when we seek to use the Word of God out of context to support our personal convictions.
- 4. We must aggressively address the thought processes we are using that violate the Word of God. This is because they can become demonic (James 3:13-18).
- 5. Every way of thinking, every speech or philosophy that displaces the knowledge and practice of God's Word is critical to defeating the influences of the flesh.
- 6. We should also "refuse foolish and ignorant speculations, knowing that they produce quarrels." (2 Timothy 2:22) If we don't, we can experience the influence of demons on our lives (2 Timothy 2:22-26).
- 7. As His children, we must learn to listen with a mind to submit to His will and positively respond to doing what God says. (John 15:1-11) An obedience that is dominated by faith in Christ alone.

B. Gear Up (v. 6):

- 1. When a believer chooses to be a doer of the Word, they end up living by faith and not by sight (James 1:22-25; 2:14-26). The Lord rewards faith (Hebrews 11:6) and moves the mountains that are fortresses in a believer's mind.
- 2. Paul is ready to destroy all refusals to hear God or to live with a careless attitude towards the Word of God (Luke 21:34; 1 Corinthians 10:12; Titus 3:8; Proverbs 13:13).
- 3. Not disobeying God takes place when there is the fullest degree to submit oneself willingly and actively to the saving will of God as we live by faith and not by sight (Hebrews 11:6).
- 4. Once we live in the Spirit of God, the following takes place:
- a) The Word of God is brought back to our remembrance (John 14:26)
- b) The Spirit of God convicts us when we sin (John 16:7-11).
- c) The Spirit illuminates the Word of God (1 Cor. 2:10-15).
- d) We are able to walk in "the light as He is in the light" so that we do not fulfill the lust of the flesh (1 John 1:5-7).
- e) We are empowered because God is at work in us, "both to will and to work for His good pleasure." (Phil. 2:13).
- f) When we pray God answers our prayers (John 15:7-10).
- 5. To experience completeness in Christ is not perfection (1 John 1:8-9) it is more influenced by the Spirit than the flesh as explained in Romans 8:12-14.
