Keep Your Mind Loose

Seeing my mother, a person who has always been a vibrant force raising eight children along with her husband, being lifted into an ambulance, then racing behind the ambulance to get to the hospital did not allow me to be sober-minded. Standing outside of a room at the hospital, not knowing if my wife was dead or alive, did not cause me to be sober-minded. These are circumstances that we may experience which may not leave us sober-minded even though we are told, "But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us." (Romans 8:37) Even though I believed verses like these at the time my heart was anxious and fearful. I must admit though that I was still hopeful.

Being sober-minded means not allowing our emotions amid difficult circumstances, to cause us to stop praying or trusting in the Word of God. For this reason, David said in Psalm 119:66-68, "Teach me good discernment and knowledge, for I believe in Your commandments. Before I was afflicted I went astray, but now I keep Your word. You are good and do good; teach me Your statutes." No matter what we experience, we must always remain teachable. When we stay teachable (a heart open to learning and applying God's Word), trials become learning experiences that grow us to become more and more dependent on the inner workings of the Holy Spirit. This process causes us to grow in wisdom, empowering us to address satan's schemes (2 Corinthians 2:11; Ephesians 6:11-12). "How blessed is the man who finds wisdom and the man who gains understanding. For her profit is better than the profit of silver and her gain better than fine gold. She is more precious than jewels; And nothing you desire compares with her. Long life is in her right hand; In her left hand are riches and honor." (Proverbs 3:12-16; NASU; "her" refers to wisdom).

A dependence on the Holy Spirit allows Him to grow so much in us that the influences of the flesh become less and less impactful on us; "for if you are living according to the flesh, you must die; but if by the Spirit you are putting to death the deeds of the body, you will live." (Romans 8:13) The more we make the willful decision to work in the Spirit we are deciding to apply God's Word by meeting anxiety with prayer (Philippians 4:4-9). We are demonstrating trust by being thankful rather than complaining (1 Thessalonians 5:18; Philippians 2:14-14), just like Job did (Job 2:10; Psalm 34). Once we obey Him amid challenging circumstances, He will work it out for our good (Romans 8:28). Therefore, choose to wait on Him by applying His Word to each issue each day (Isaiah 40:27-31). This is how we keep our minds loose.

SERMON OUTLINE

Loosed and Ready 1 Peter 1:13-16

A. Loose Your Mind (v. 13):

- 1. In Oriental cultures, they wore long robes . When they had to travel long distances, they would tuck their robes into the belts in order to move quickly to their destination.
- 2. The believers underwent fiery trials (1:7) that tested their faith in the Lord. Rome persecuted them horribly. Since he failed Christ when He was on trial, Peter challenges them to be prepared for action by being ready to learn and trust the Word of God so they can readily apply it to their circumstances.
- 3. We must allow this mindset to occupy our thoughts. We must be able to come to a clear understanding of God's Word based on an accurate interpretation, so we can assertively address the issues we may experience.
- 4. We must continuously and habitually not allow our emotions to override our commitment to obey the scriptures.
- 5. We are commanded to make a decisive decision, once and for all, to expect the Lord to do what He promises in His Word because the Word endures forever (1 Peter 1:23-25) and it does not return unfulfilled (Isaiah 55:11).
- 6. We must focus on the knowledge that while obeying the Lord's will, if we sin, Christ will generously, spontaneously, and with no reservation, provide to us His favor once we confess our sins (1 John 8-10). We must trust that His grace is sufficient (2 Corinthians 12:7-10).
- 7. This mindset allows us to count our trials as joy (James 1:2-4) and trust the discipline of the Lord (Hebrews 12:4-11).

B. The Ready Stance of an Overcomer (vs. 14-16):

- 1. To be obedient is to willfully decide to submit to the Lord's will . After all, He needs to transform us to holiness. To gird up knowing the Word is one thing. Complying to His will in the heat of a trial is a mindset that Peter says we must possess.
- 2. When our minds are girded up and sober, we are continuously being transformed through the ministry of the Holy Spirit (Romans 12:2), so that we do not go back to our old ways of thinking in the heat of fiery trials (1 Peter 5:9-10).
- 3. Going back to our old way of thinking causes us to put back on the old man (Ephesians 4:17-24) and live a carnal life before God and man (1 Corinthians 3:1-3).
- 4. God is deity by His very nature which means there is absolutely no possibility that the world can have an evil influence upon His character. By His very nature, He is holy.
- 5. When no one was seeking God and had no desire for God (Romans 3:9-11), He drew us to Himself (John 6:44), providing us a desire for His Word (Romans 10:9) so that by depositing the Holy Spirit inside of us (Ephesians 3:16; Titus 3:4-8) we would have the ability to walk with Him.
- 6. Since we are blessed to experience His grace and the deposit of the Holy Spirit inside of us, we must gird up our minds and remain sober so that our dedication to the Lord is endless. This allows us to no longer walk in the flesh, but in the Spirit (Galatians 5:16-25: Romans 7).
- 7. We must focus our lives on embracing the 'whole Christian walk', which includes "counting our trials joy". (James 1:2-4). This process is not just a Sunday morning experience, but an experience that requires, "presenting our bodies as living sacrifices" daily (Romans 12:1-2).
- 8. The Lord, because of all He has done and does for us to move from becoming saved to being holy, commands us to consecrate ourselves to Him and devote ourselves to serve Him. This mindset maturates us to holiness (John 15:1-13; Philippians 2:13).
