
# Pastoral REFLECTIONS

## See Beyond

One day, a certain rich man visited a rabbi, who took the rich man by the hand and led him to a window. "Look out there through the glass window," he said. The rich man looked into the street, "what do you see?" asked the rabbi. "I see men, women, and children," answered the rich man. Again, the rabbi took him by the hand and, this time, led him to a mirror. The rabbi asked, "Now what do you see?" Puzzled and somewhat bewildered, the rich man said, "Now I see myself." Then the rabbi said, "Behold, in the window, there is glass, and in the mirror, there is glass. Now, what do you see?" But the glass of the mirror is covered with a bit of silver (the rabbi used this to signify money), and no sooner is the silver added, you cease to see others; you see only yourself."



When we are saved, the Holy Spirit, who is the very nature of God, comes into our lives and takes up residence (Romans 8:1-3, 11), calling our bodies His temple, His dwelling place (1 Corinthians 6:19-20). The more we commit to obeying God, the more the Holy Spirit influences our lives. The more we submit ourselves to the direction of the Holy Spirit, as we implement God's Word, the more the Holy Spirit empowers us to die to our own thoughts and feelings that may operate contrary to the Word of God (Romans 12:2). This is why the scriptures state that anyone who is a disciple of Christ loves others (John 13:34-35; Matthew 22:37-40).

Giving to God is difficult when we look in the mirror, rather than through the glass under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Giving to God is difficult when the silver (money) behind the mirror causes us to focus on ourselves (1 Tim. 6:17-19). But when we remove the selfish use of money by deciding to obey Christ, we can clearly see the needs of our church as it ministers to the lives of others.

## SERMON OUTLINE

# The Sower 2 Corinthians 9:10-12

#### A. The Supply Chain (v. 10):

- 1. God continuously provides (non-stop). It is His resources; as a result, that defray the cost of what believers give.
- 2. God is the creator, so He is the one who provides seed to the person who continuously sows. This is something no one has the power to make happen.
- 3. When a giver continuously scatters God's provision with a cheerful heart and sows bountifully into God's ministry (2 Corinthians 9:6-8), God continuously provides His resources to them. These are resources that He creates out of nothing. "There is one who scatters, and yet increases all the more. And there is one who withholds what is justly due, and yet it results only in want." (Proverbs 11:24)
- 4. This Sower is one who continuously gives and gives abundantly (Luke 6:38).
- 5. For the giver described above, God supplies them their daily food (Deuteronomy 8:2-6; John 6:26-40; Luke 12:13-23).
- 6. A believer's obedience to the Word of God is due to the inner workings of the Holy Spirit (Philippians 2:12-13). The more they submit to God in this area, the more they live by faith and not sight. This mindset transforms the believers' life into a person deeply committed to do what pleases God.
- 7. Abundant giving leads to conformity to all of God's Word. A person that learns this surrenders to God for everything (Philippians 3:7-11).
- 8. A believer who is of the nature of verse 10 will constantly experience an abundance in everything, whether it is health, spiritual, financial, or in their family (Psalm 112, 128).
- 9. This believer, who lives by faith, experiences the Lord so powerfully as their giver; their faith grows deeper, so their gifts are very generous.

#### B. Blessed Givers Empower God's Agenda (vs. 11b -12):

- 1. God's bountiful favor to a liberal giver continuously produces a joyous worship-filled heart. They become a sincere worshipper.
- 2. The major purpose of this (Sower is nominative, and 'for the ministry' is also nominative) is to ensure God's agenda for the church, His love for the saints, and their love for each other is executed powerfully.
- 3. This is a reference to priestly service (Philippians 2:17) that is focused on those in leadership furthering the agenda of God. They can serve full-time in ministry so the church's services are conducted with decency and order (1 Corinthians 14:40).
- 4. Whomever is committed to living a consecrated, devoted life before God, the church must do its best to care for what they lack that is essential to their lives. This is given to those consecrated to God, not those caught up in worldly lust; that is why Paul specifies saints (1 John 2:15-17).
- 5. Because the ministry can effectively execute God's agenda so that lives are being transformed, those giving liberally are ecstatic because they are experiencing God's bountiful blessings. The saints are being strengthened in their time of need as the whole church experiences exuberant, vivacious worship before God.


