
# Pastoral REFLECTIONS

## Selfless

A young man and a young woman had pledged to each other and were looking forward to a near wedding day when the young man was suddenly called to service. From the warfare field, letters regularly came and went, and love shone brightly in all of them. Then, letters from the young man abruptly ceased. A few weeks passed, and a letter came in a strange handwriting. In it, the young woman read:



That letter was never answered. By the next train, the young woman journeyed southward. She left the train and went directly to the hospital. Inquiring about the location of the young man's cot, she quietly approached and suddenly flung herself down by the side of his cot with the passionate words, "I will never give you up. Love at its best is selfless. It is the true nature of love (John 3:16; 1 Corinthians 13:4-8) that causes Christ to die a brutal death for people who did not desire Him (Romans 3:11) or deserve His love (Ephesians 2:1-10). Christ's selflessness led to love being manifested at its very best (John 15:13; "Greater love has no one than this that one lay down his life for a friend."). When this kind of love is hard to express, it is best displayed by selfless acts of love.

Then, little Mary was asked to spell love. She didn't stop to give the letters, but ran, threw her arms around the teacher's neck, and kissed her on the cheek. ### SERMON OUTLINE

#### **A Love Story** Ruth 2:17-23

#### A. It's Sacrificial (vs. 17-18):


- 1. Because Ruth was a widow, she was able to pick up the stalks of grain that were required by law to be left behind for widows. With no possible job and no husband, the timing of the harvest was perfect and totally needed to survive. Ruth, every day and all day, did this with no plans to stop until the season had come to an end. She seems to have only eaten one meal
- 2. It is powerfully interesting to see how God was putting together His handy work because of Ruth's character. Her love for her mother-in-law led her to the right field of a wealthy landowner with a large enough crop for Ruth to have enough food for herself and her mother-in-law.
- 3. Ruth's love for Naomi energizes her to work beyond everyone's expectations continuously.

#### B. It's Loyal (vs. 18-19):

- 1. Ruth came directly to Naomi. This shows how purposeful she was. Once she was with Naomi, Naomi clearly understood what Ruth had accomplished. As a Jewish woman, Naomi fully comprehended what it must have taken to acquire such a large amount of barley in one day.
- 2. Namoi was so amazed by the amount of barley collected that she viewed what Ruth did as going beyond what most widows typically collect and therefore characterized Ruth as laboring (toiling) out of an ethical obligation to please her.
- 3. Namoi heard all that Boaz did to help Ruth, so she immediately took things to the next level by sharing her desire that Boaz become more acquainted with Ruth to the point that he becomes completely aware of who she is.
- 4. Naomi wants Ruth to experience God's favor, so Boaz engages with her so that she prospers and
- 5. Ruth explained that Boaz was the man who took notice of her and made sure she worked closer to his maidens than she related to the other widows. This means that Ruth became one of his workers, which caused her to gain more than was provided to widows.
- 6. True love is shared loyalty, and this blend nurtures a relationship to be life-changing and powerful in God's sight.

#### C. It's Refreshing (vs. 20-23):

- 1. Naomi was totally engaged in what Ruth reported and kept speaking to her daughter-in-law to learn about all that had happened.
- 2. No matter how awful Naomi and Ruth's life circumstances may have seemed, the fact that Ruth went to Boaz's field and experienced his kindness in the manner in which she did now makes it evident to Naomi that the Lord is truly steadfast and generous in affectionately loving them during the worst time of their lives.
- 3. Naomi apparently knew of Boaz, but God's loving act caused Naomi to engage Ruth with Boaz. It was not Naomi's strategic plan; it was all based on God's providential love.
- 4. Ruth agrees with Naomi and explains that Boaz's actions demonstrate his loyalty to her by having her remain like glue to his servants rather than among the widows. He protected her because he knew she was a Moabitess.
- 5. Naomi told Ruth that it would be practical for her to remain with Boaz's maids. It would also be more pleasant for her if she did because of the uncertainty of what might happen if she strayed into someone else's field, which may not be kind to a Moabitess.
- 6. The entire time Ruth worked very close to Boaz and his maids, she remained permanently with Naomi, which means that even though she knew Boaz had an interest in her, she kept herself from being involved with him. Ruth held the relationship a working relationship until the end of
- 7. True love offers hope for everyone: hope for Boaz to find a wife, hope for Ruth to find a husband, hope for Naomi to restore all her lost family, and hope for mankind to see Jesus.
- 8. Genuine love is empowered by God (1 John 4:7-14) and blesses all those involved.
