Stand Up!

It is said that King Philip of Macedon fell asleep one day while hearing a case. Waking suddenly and not having all the facts of the case straight, King Philip passed an unjust sentence on the man who was at the king's mercy. Stunned by the sentence, the poor man cried, "I appeal!" Startled, the king asked, "And to whom do you appeal?" The man replied, "From the king who was sleeping to the king who is waking." The king was so moved by the man's logical appeal that he reversed the judgment he had passed. (Encyclopedia of 15,000 Illustrations: Signs of the Times).

Many times, when we are faced with moments where individuals may believe they were treated unjustly, it is easy for believers to say nothing and pray. This can lead to bitterness, anger, and resentment. The scriptures are clear that to say nothing encourages more evil. "Therefore at such a time the prudent person keeps silent,

for it is an evil time." (Amos 5:13; NASU) Many times, when Christ was challenged for being evil, He spoke up. In the case where the Pharisees accused Him of being with satan, Christ openly addressed them (Matthew 12:22-29). When Peter was addressing those who were struggling under Nero's ruthless oppression, Peter instructed these believers to speak up; "Who is there to harm you if you prove zealous for what is good? But even if you should suffer for the sake of righteousness, you are blessed, and do not fear their intimidation....always being ready to make a defense to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence; and keep a good conscience so that in the thing in which you are slandered, those who revile your good behavior in Christ will be put to shame." (1 Peter 3:13-16; NASU) Our silence can encourage more evil to proliferate.

Jesus Christ's mission on earth was for the oppressed, and most of His miracles and acts of kindness were to disadvantaged people; "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor. He sent me to proclaim release to the captives, and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free those who are oppressed, to proclaim the favorable year of the Lord." (Luke 5:18-19). Christ went to the Samaritan woman and even spent time with those who came out of the village to hear His message (John 4:39-45); not a good look for a Jew (see Acts 10).

The question is not whether we should speak up or serve needs (Matthew 25:31-40; we will be rewarded eternally for this), but how we do so with words that are seasoned and edifying (Colossians 4:6; Ephesians 4:29). We are where we are today because many spoke up, stood up, including Christ; be counted, be a blessing!

SERMON OUTLINE

Follow Justice Deuteronomy 16:18-20

A. God's Way (v. 18):


- 1. The people in places of authority need to be carefully instituted because they would rule over those who appoint them, not God.
- Being a part of the voting process is a Biblical responsibility, not just a civil one.
- It is essential to determine who governs and arbitrates cases while providing leadership over the issues because they are required to execute the rights of the people justly, no matter who the people are.
- They also needed leaders to function among them so that what was litigated was faithfully executed into the life of the community.
- In the New Testament, the church community establishes His principles into the life of the people (Ephesians 1:9-11; 1 Timothy 3:15). The people who oversee this are the pastor (1 Timothy 4:11-13; Titus 2:13-15), elders, and deacons (1 Timothy 3:1-13; Acts 6:1-6). This is because God executes His agenda for the world through the church (Ephesians 1:22-23), which is the restraining force against the attacks of satan (Ephesians 3:8-12). This is why we have chaos on earth when the church fails in Revelation. We hold the keys to lock and unlock the gates of Hades (Matthew 16:13-20).
- It is essential for these leaders to have unwavering adherence to God's standards and live by them because it is due to them that believers in the Christian community are encouraged to execute God's principles in their lives and the life of the community (1 Timothy 4:15-16; Hebrews 13:7-8). As a result, the government structure that leads the Lord's community leads first by example.

B. Without Partiality (v. 19):

- 1. No one should emphatically negate any part of the law by willfully or inadvertently assembling a group of people who seek to change the laws or distort or interrupt the execution of God's laws.
- When the Lord's laws are not implemented correctly, they corrupt the character of those responsible for executing them and eventually blind their judgment (2 Peter 1:3-11). The Word of God is a light when it is purely interpreted (Psalm 119:105; 1 John 1:5-7).
- Corrupting the implementation of God's laws in the community overthrows the righteous implementation of the law and, therefore, creates an "intense state of destruction and ruin to the community's life " (Proverb 13:6).

C. Experience God's Protection (v. 20):

- 1. There is no way for the Lord's Word to live powerfully in His community's life if His standards do not reign above everyone's ideologies, feelings, or biases. His standards must be held without bias. Those who execute it must learn to live by faith (Habakkuk 2:4).
- 2. The leaders must have one state of mind, which is to personally practice the Word of God and, with purpose and determination, execute the Word of God in the community's life.
- When the community functions under the authority of the Lord God, there is no way they will not experience His protection and blessings every day of their lives. If they encounter difficulties, the Lord God will restore, preserve, and establish them so that they are dominant in the land.
- Our impact on the world, so that we are more than conquerors (Romans 8:37), is determined by being salt and light to the world (Matthew 5:13-16). Once we are committed in this manner, we restrain Satan's influence (Matthew 16:13-20; Ephesians 3:8-10), allowing the church to set the Lord's agenda to the world (Ephesians 1:22-23).
