
Pastoral REFLECTIONS

JUNE 9, 2024



From a human standpoint, I have always wondered what it was like to wait 25 years for one child while being promised you (Abraham) would have a nation with inhabitants like sands of the sea shore, something he never saw. How did he not waver in faith (Romans 4:18-21)? He was told to leave a stable life in Haran only to have a nomadic life (moving from place to place, no restroom facilities, no kitchen, etc.), living in a tent throughout Canaan and then to become separated from his cousin Lot. He had to fight a war against the two kings of Sodom and Gomorrah to defend and save his cousin Lot. He had to deal with 'baby mama drama' because of issues between Sarah and Hagar. He had to kick Ishmael out of his house, whom he loved. He had to endure a drought only to be forced to go to Egypt with a pretty wife when God knew that Pharaoh loved pretty women. How could this be living in the will of God?



Living in the will of God does expose us to adverse situations. Please note that no matter what individuals in the scriptures experienced while obeying God, God's purposes were accomplished, and each individual became stronger. The circumstances that encompassed them were threatening, but never defeating (2 Corinthians 4:7-12) because the Word of God does not return void (Isaiah 55:11). He promises to protect us (Hebrews 1:14). Christ told the disciples they would have trouble (John 16:33), but He promised never to forsake them (Matthew 28:20). David, with all that he experienced said; "The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear Him, and rescues them.....; how blessed is the man who takes refuge in Him! O fear the Lord you His saints; for those who fear Him there is no want." (Psalm 34:7-9).

Satan is going to be Satan. However, God's love is greater! The more we are tested, the more we grow in our faith, and the more we are exposed to how "Greater love has no one...." (John 15:7-10, 13). In our pain, God faithfully delivers His promises, which includes His protection and power while being refined to become like Him (Galatians 2:20; 1 Peter 1:3-9); no loss, just gain (Philippians 1:21).

SERMON OUTLINE

Got Faith? 1 Samuel 18:10-30 Part II

A. Regardless (vs. 12-13):

- 1. No matter how much Saul sought to destroy David, David was not afraid of Saul. David's commitment was to obey God and to live by faith and not by sight; faith conquers fear (Joshua 1:5-9).
- 2. An evil spirit having full access to Saul to do what he wanted with him is evidence that the Lord no longer covered him. It was only a matter of time before he went from a lot of success (1 Samuel 14) to defeat (1 Samuel 24:1-15; 26, 31). God may allow an evil person to live, but it is only for the full measure of their sins to be accounted for (1 Thessalonians 2:14). Once that is complete, there will be a day of accountability.
- 3. People may never like us, but our steadfast commitment to the will of God should earn their respect; for this, the Lord will bless us.
- 4. When we are saved, the Lord's presence is continually in us because He lives in side us (1 Corinthians 6:19; Titus 3:4-8). When we abide in His Word no matter what external pressures may be, the Lord loves us (John 15:7-10 and disciplines us (Hebrews 12:4-11). Practicing the Word causes us to experience the full movement of the Holy Spirit so that we no longer walk in the flesh but in the Spirit (Ephesians 5:15-18). So, no matter what external pressures we may experience, the power within strengthens us so that we can overpower the attacks of the enemy (Ephesians 3:14-21; 1 John 4:4). What David experienced is no longer unique to him.
- 5. Our good behavior may not only bless us but also attract negative attention. Christ did good every day but was nailed to a cross.
- 6. It does not matter what evil a person may intend for us to experience; when the Lord decides to bless us, they can do nothing to prevent blessings from being be stowed on us.

B. Faith Is Victory Guaranteed (vs. 17-18, 28-30; Hebrews 11:6):

- 1. Satan never backs off. Remember Peter, who Christ said was being sifted like wheat (Luke 22:31). Well because Peter did not remain sober (1 Peter 1:13-16), Satan got to him. This is why Peter says, "Satan is a roaring lion seeking someone to devour." Notice Peter did not say 'seeking someone to tell a white lie;' no devour. Satan had an evil spirit influencing him.
- 2. Satan's strategy is to get us to depend on our strength rather than the inner power of the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 3:16-17; 6:10). Remember what Satan said to Christ when tempting Him: "If You are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here..." (Luke 4:9). The same with Eve. He told her she could be just like God (Genesis 3:1-7).
- 3. God's timing (2 Peter 3:8) can seem insensitive to our pain, but it's a refinement process (James 1:2-4; 1 Peter 1:3-9) that leads to victory. David became a leader of 400 hundred mighty warriors that dominated the world (2 Samuel 22:2, 25:13; 30:10; 2 Samuel 23:8-39) and loved him dearly (2 Samuel 23:16).
- 4. It does not matter what traps people set for us; "....greater is He who is in us...." (1 John 4:4). This may infuriate some and cause others to become more sophisticated with their traps against us, but remember: the Lord "is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us" (Ephesians 3:20), and "in all things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us." (Romans 8:37) Even if they mean it for evil, the Lord can turn it for good (Romans 8:28). "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Romans 8:31)


