# Pastoral REFLECTIONS

August 25, 2024



Temptation is a powerful animal that can devour all of us (Matthew 4:3. 1 Thessalonians 3:5). The Word of God states in Galatians 5:17, "For the flesh sets its desire against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh, for these are in opposition to one another, so that you may not do the things that you please." This verse should remind us of the power of temptation. Temptation is so powerful for Joseph that he leaves his garment and runs. However, in the case of David, he did not run; he satisfied the flesh by first looking at Bathsheba, which led to adultery and murder. Because the flesh is weak, we must behave like Joseph and flee. This may be why the Lord's Prayer includes temptation. Matthew 6:13 states, "And do not lead us into temptation but deliver us from evil."

One three-year-old's explanation for being in the kitchen atop a chair eating cookies is: "I just climbed up to smell them, and my tooth got caught."

Satan always appeals to the flesh. This is where he starts with Eve because he knows the flesh's propensity with its five senses. Satan at the tree clearly shows how he still approaches us using the five senses tied up in the flesh. He still does this, especially since he knows nothing is good in the flesh (Romans 7:24). John says that for anyone who loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him (1 John 2:15-17).

Temptation, however, is not powerful only because of the flesh; it is also powerful because Satan knows our weaknesses and uses them to defeat us (Ephesians 6:12). This is why it is good to flee in the midst of temptation. Paul instructs Timothy to do this in 2 Timothy 2:22: "Now flee from youthful lusts, and pursue righteousness, faith, love, and peace, with those who call on the Lord from a pure heart."

Despite the overwhelming power of temptation, remember this: "No temptation has overtaken you, but such as is common to man; and God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will provide the way of escape also, that you may be able to endure it."(1 Corinthians 10:13) Temptation is indeed powerful, but we can take heart in the fact that "greater is He who is in you than he who is in the world." (1 John 4:4) With God's strength, we can resist and overcome.

# SERMON OUTLINE

# **Word Count Proverbs 15:4; Matthew 15:18;** Matthew 12:36-37; Ephesians 4:29-30

### A. Our Words (Proverbs 15:4; Matthew 15:18):

- 1. A tongue that is influenced by a peaceful, content emotional attitude so that there is no harsh word or deed.
- 2. The "tree of life" is the tree that gives one eternal, everlasting life. Like fruit trees, words should stimulate spiritual growth in the other person's life.
- 3. A person listening to the words of another can damage relationships when they take what a person says, don't ask them what they mean or follow the scriptures when someone offends them, and distort what they may have meant. The word means to twist.
- 4. A person can be totally destroyed when we speak in this manner. Crushed is a word that describes a city that is demolished and placed into ruins. "The tongue has the power of life and death, and those who love it will eat its fruit." (Proverbs 18:21; NIV)
- 5. A perverse tongue can take the life out of a person so that they become useless. "A lying tongue hates those it crushes, And a flattering mouth works ruin." (Proverbs 26:28; NASU)
- 6. When a person repeatedly speaks on their own initiative so those around them can hear what they are saying. This person speaks in a manner that has become the signature of their life.
- 7. This manner of speaking describes a person's deepest emotional state, who they are, their mindset, and what they intend to do.
- 8. People can be persuaded by individuals' religious status, power, the manner in which they dress, smooth and flattering speeches, and the status they hold in society, but God says to listen to the words they repeatedly say, and that describes their heart. This is the difference we see between Saul and David (1 Samuel 9:1-2,8; 10:19, 23-24; 16:1-11).

### B. Words Matter (Matthew 12:36-37):

- 1. Careless words apply to anyone who speaks without a careful evaluation of knowledge on the issue, facts in a case, or any conversation that is useless to the persons involved.
- 2. Every word that a person speaks that is useless is recorded. The total number of words will be tallied and addressed upon the day of judgment. This is why a wise person ages their words and practices true religion (James 1:26).
- 3. God will act on all these words to determine righteousness. Righteousness will be rewarded. On the day of judgment, we will learn who submitted to the Lord's way of being good stewards of our words.
- 4. The words that had no careful evaluation of facts, not committed to the true, use less words God will pronounce His sentence on them (Proverbs 6:19; Revelation 22:15).

### C. Speak Life (Ephesians 4:29-30):

- 1. To purposefully use words to hurt someone. Functioning in the flesh leads to words that tear others down (Galatians 5:20).
- 2. When the Holy Spirit does not direct words, it corrupts relationships.
- 3. We must be committed to continuously not allowing unwholesome words to come from within us, so we remain under the Spirit's control (Ephesians 3:16-19).
- 4. Whatever we are about to say should be profitable, useful, and pleasing to God.
- 5. We are commanded not to persistently sadden or distress the Holy Spirit by using unwholesome words. We must keep the faith no matter how emotional our interactions may become. When we do, we function like the tree of life.


